


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WORDS FROM OUR PARTNER

DIRECTING COMEDY OF ERRORS

hat a joy it's been to dive into what may very well be Shakespeare's silliest play! In talking with Richard about doing these shows in repertory, I became very excited about featuring true actor magic in a theatrical experience that brings light, joy, and unabashed silliness. Our small ensemble transforms into many characters, and I knew that I wanted to bring the audience right into the heart of these magical transformations. This is a play in every sense of the word pretty much the opposite of realism and I wanted to frame the story in a way that shares and maximizes the fun of putting on a performance. I also wanted to create a world that would encourage the ensemble and myself to really "go for it" in a highly physical style of comedy that would



highlight just how accessible this story is for all audiences. But how to do all this? Well, I always like to go to the text and see what images stand out for me in what the characters say and do. While trying to understand the "errors" he keeps getting caught up in, Antipholus of Syracuse supposes



that he's landed in a place that's full of some kind of magic-a town of jugglers and tricksters. Meanwhile, Dromio is about as classic a clown character as you can find, and there are "bits" in the script that read exactly like vaudeville. So, we have jugglers, magicians, clowns... the world of The Comedy of Errors is basically a carnival! Then Richard told me that he had this idea that for both shows we might start with a group of Depression era traveling players, and I thought that was a perfect frame for a group that comes in and performs this show in the style of circus

I'm so deeply grateful to our amazing team of actors, designers and crew for making all my carnival dreams come true, and to Richard for inviting me along for the ride.
